Please keep a look out for dates and times, as these have not yet been finalised. On Saturday 21st at 11am, we invite everyone to join in a rousing time of carol singing in Broad Street. Not only is this an opportunity for public witness, but it will help to raise much-needed funds for *'Winchester Youth Counselling'*, the charity we are supporting this year.

The local community has formed two volunteer groups offering a shared Christmas Day lunch for elderly Alresford residents. The first is at Bailey House, where house manager Sally Holmes and her family will put on lunch for up to 12 people. The second venue will be at Makins Court, where Julie Cleeve and family will provide lunch for about 30 people. Pam Stevens will organise the town mini-bus to provide transport for the day. We are indeed grateful to all these volunteers and it is good to know that no one in Alresford needs to spend Christmas Day alone.

Looking forward into the New Year, we will start by celebrating together the joint Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. A service will be held at St John's on 19th January, beginning at 4.30pm with a 'Bring and Share' afternoon tea and followed by a service at 6pm. It's a great opportunity to start 2020 with the strength of a united Christian community in Alresford.
